8-1 - The rank of the contestants will be according to the list above. In addition, the teacher for the "champion of champions" of each group will be awarded the "The Best Coach Award."

8-2 - When the total scores for two contestants totals to be the same, the winner will be determined by whomever scored higher on the 7th Paper. If the scores the 7th Paper are also the same, then the winner is determined by the higher score in the following order: 3rd Paper, 1st, 2nd, 6th, 4th, and the 5th.

8-3 – Champions of each group are limited to max. 10 contestants.

## ***9. ATTENTION***

- The hosting country appoints judges of the competition.
- The judge's decisions are final, once decisions have been made, there will be no changes.
- All contestants should attend the Awards Ceremony. The final score will be announced at that time.
- The hosting country and its honored guests will present the award.
- Certificates will be distributed to member countries during the meeting after competition.

## ***11. ANNUAL JOURNAL***

- Congratulatory Remarks - 1 Page
- Pictures of Activities within your country - 2 pages
- Successful Abacus and Mental Arithmetic teaching experiences and comments - 2 pages

## ***12. PRIZE TOURNAMENT***

12-1 – Each member country recommends an outstanding contestant to participate.

12-2 - The total number of Gold Medal winners will be 30% of the contestants, prize US \$200. The total number of Silver Medal winners will be 30% of the contestants, prize US \$150. The total number of Bronze Medal winners will be 40% of the contestants, prize US \$100.

## ***13. MISCELLANEOUS***

13-1 - Please submit any changes to contest groups by ***October 9, 2015*** or I will be unable to accept them.

13-2 - Each country is limited to 2 representatives to take photos for individual awards or group awards of the member country at the Awards Ceremony.

13-3 - PAMA USA will provide each attending country with a DVD with the pictures taken during the competition and the Awards Ceremony.

13-4 - We will only provide 2 contribution medals to all attending countries.

If you need or want to have more plaques made, there will be an extra charge.

13-5 – All chairmen can be either a Time Judge or a Score Judge for the Prize Tournament. Host country will assign the judge for each contest item.
